Daniel is one of the 15 Canadian Heroes (Duspost magazine 2007) who contributed to changing the world through volunteering. He is essentially a Costume Designer, Painter, Writer and a man with a passion for International Development be it in Bali, Brazil,

Guatemala or India, his horizons are ever expanding. He presently lives and works in Brazil on projects for young social entrepreneurs from low income communities.

In Pappankalan community of less privileged people, Daniel initiated an educational integration project for children and training programmes in sewing and embroidery for women. With the help of 'Give a Hand', Daniel's dream of putting the ever increasing groups under one roof came true in 2010. Moving on to the new venture, fondly called The Lotus Club, Daniel wants to maximise the use of this new centre. The Lotus Club will usher a novel new world full of dreams and promises offering an environment where children can develop and flourish through various fun-filled activities like sports, yoga, music, visual arts, computer literacy etc. The Club will be under the supervision of five suitable teachers.
